

Proceedings of the 38<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Executive Council of Mo School Abhiyan Parichalana Sangathan (MSAPS) held on 25.01.2023 at 10:30 AM in the Conference Room of S & ME Department, Govt of Odisha

The 38<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Executive Council of Mo School Abhiyan Parichalana Sangathan (MSAPS) was held on 25.01.2023 at 10.30 AM in the Conference Room of S&ME Department, Govt of Odisha under the Chairpersonship of Commissioner cum Secretary, S&ME Department cum Chairperson, Executive Council, MSAPS. The list of members attended the meeting has been attached at **Annexure-I**.

The Chief Operating Officer (COO) delivered the presentation and the Executive Council discussed the agenda and status of on-going programs and projects. The decisions taken thereof are as follows:

The EC, MSAPS is thereby requested to approve (post facto) and recommend the same to the GC, MSAPS for consideration. Execution will be subject to govt. approval.</p> <p><b>II.
